- The **doxology** is at the end of the prayer. It is a sentence of praise where we give God all the credit for our spiritual life and salvation. We honor Him with our thanks. See 1 Timothy 1:17.
- "Amen" means "Yes, it shall be so." When we say *Amen* we express that we are sure that God hears our prayers and answers them. See 2 Corinthians 1:18-20 and 1 John 5:14.
